HEARING LOSS, COGNITIVE DECLINE & DEMENTIA

- Research shows that hearing loss is associated with cognitive decline, increasing the risk of dementia in the elderly.¹
- A long-term study followed patients for 25 years and found that individuals who wore hearing aids had the same levels of cognitive decline as people with normal hearing.²
- In the study, those who went untreated demonstrated significantly lower cognitive function scores.²
